1) Proposed Rulemaking

Revisions are being proposed for 4 CSR 240-40.020, 4 CSR 240-40.030, and 4 CSR 240-40.080 to adopt several amendments of the Federal Pipeline Safety Regulations that have not been incorporated in these Missouri PSC rules. These revisions will make the Missouri Pipeline Safety Regulations at least as stringent as the Federal Pipeline Safety Regulations. Case No. GW-2012-0429 is a working docket that has been established to receive the proposed draft revisions and then comments from stakeholders. The Staff also plans to discuss these revisions at the Natural Gas Operations Seminar as discussed in item 3) below. If you have any questions, please contact Staff.

2) OPID Validation

191.22(b) requires an operator who has already been assigned one or more OPID by January 1, 2011, must validate the information associated with each OPID through the National Registry of Pipeline and LNG Operators at http://opsweb.phmsa.dot.gov, and correct that information as necessary. PHMSA Advisory Bulletin ADB-2012-04 requires corrected information to be submitted no later than September 30, 2012.
